Julie Daniel, founder of Daniel Training Center, Apex Riding Academy, and Silver Stirrup Foundation (a registered 501(c)(3)) has positioned herself and her team, including Kasey Moffat and Lauren Stephenson, to be top-of-mind when someone mentions equine lesson programs. Apex Riding Academy, which was founded in 2015 uses retired show horses to give dozens of lessons each week at her Scottsdale, AZ based facility.

As concern grows about the decline of participation in our competitive Arabian horse sport, natural questions like 'how do we get more people involved in our breed?' arise. One way to get more people involved is to make the Arabian horse attainable through lesson programs and academy shows. She has had a career full of twists, turns and redirection, but has now found herself with a system that allows her riders to compete on the highest of levels, engages new people with our breed, and lets her utilize her business acumen in strategic ways.
